The School is here—Dream comes true

It was the middle of September 2008 when we received the good news from Tibet. The school and home for the sixty plus orphans and poor children has completed! This is a dream comes true for Sonam Rinpoche who has always wanted to improve the lives of the unfortunate children through education.

This is project that have a strong grass-root support from the local community. The construction of the project were led by Tashi Rinpoche and Khengo Losal,

The construction started in April 2008. It was built with mud and wood by the local craftsmen and the villagers. The outside of the building is beautifully painted to reflect the colorful Tibetan culture. Altogether there are 2 teacher quarters, 12 student quarters and one big classroom.

Each room can accommodate 4 students comfortably up to maximum of 6. ...Continued on page 2.

As you know Fall is here and the cold weather has arrived, so does the cold wind gust on Tibetan mountains and plateaus. The school 'Nga Gyur Shed Dup Choe Ling' is located around 12,000 ft above sea level, an average height of Tibetan mountains. The school has started

accepting children in Fall this year. The children are either orphans (given top priority) or very poor children from local villages. The children will live and study in the same school compound. The children ages range between 6 and 14 years old. These children do not even

know how to read or write their own names. This will be the very first formal education for all of them. The current academic strategy emphasizes on basic education; much like an K or 1st grade. It is our mission to improve the lives of the Tibetan needy children ...continue on page 3

The building is single level. Right side of the student quarters is a huge class room building (photo above). Left side of student quarter are teachers' quarters.

The school is named “Nga Gyur Shed Dup Choe Ling” which literally means “The

Early Translated Dharma Teaching and Study Center” in Tibetan. Due to the remoteness of the school, there is no electricity nor water supply. The student quarters are smartly positioned to face East to get maximum light into the room.

Even without the heat, to the Tibetan kids, they are seeing a big improvement moving from

a **yak-hair tent** into a building and they will be much warmer in their **NEW HOME**.
